



## Application for Export Permit and Health Certificate

Form approved under subsection 1A.29 of the *Export Control (Animals) Order 2004*

### Section A: General information

**Purpose of this form** For licensed livestock exporters to apply for an export permit and health certificate to export live-stock under their approved arrangement.

**For the export of sheep between the months of May and October that travel through waters in the Arabian Sea north of latitude 11°N**

- i.  the vessel on which the sheep are to be transported is equipped with automatic live-stock watering systems that have water receptacles at a height suitable for the sheep
- j.  details of those watering systems are set out in the record of equipment and arrangements attached to the Australian certificate for the carriage of livestock for the vessel issued by the Australian Maritime Safety Authority under *Marine Order 43 (Cargo and cargo handling—livestock) 2018*
- k.  a heat stress management plan for the proposed export voyage is in place
- l.  bedding (such as straw, shavings or sawdust) of at least 1 tonne for every 10,000 sheep will be provided on the vessel
- m.  the area of the pen space on the vessel for each sheep, and that the pen space for each sheep meets the requirements in section 10 of the *Australian Meat and Live-stock Industry (Export of Sheep by Sea to Middle East) Order 2018*
- n.  the pen air turnover for the vessel has been verified by an independent qualified mechanical engineer as required by subsection 9(1) of the *Australian Meat and Live-stock Industry (Export of Sheep by Sea to Middle East) Order 2018*.

**2 I declare that I will**

- a. transport and load animals in accordance with my approved arrangement, export plan and ASEL and any applicable approved contingency plans
- b. retain all documents required to support the declarations in this application and provide them to the department on request
- c. comply and I am in a position to comply with the approved ESCAS that applies to this export consignment (*if applicable*)
- d. have someone listed in management and control to oversee loading of the animals.

**3 If exporting by sea, I declare that (*select one only*)**

I will not load animals onto trucks until I have biosecurity (sea ports) clearance and Australian Safety Maritime Authority (AMSA) approval (if required) for the vessel.

Or

I have an approved management plan in my export plan to meet ASEL requirements if biosecurity clearance and AMSA approval (if required) is not given for the vessel.

**4 I declare that**

- a. the information I have provided is true and accurate
- b. I have complied with any conditions to which the export licence under the *Australian Meat and Livestock Industry Act 1997* is subject to, **AND** any requirement under that Act that otherwise relate to the export of livestock.
- c. I am aware it is a criminal offence under the *Criminal Code Act 1995* to knowingly give false or misleading information to a Commonwealth officer exercising powers under Commonwealth law

## Section C: Privacy notice

'Personal information' means any information or opinion about an identified, or reasonably identifiable, individual.

If you fail to provide some or all of your personal information, the Department of Agriculture and Water Resources may not be able to process your application.

The Department of Agriculture and Water Resources may disclose your personal information to relevant authorities in an importing country and other Australian agencies, including the Australian Maritime Safety Authority and the Australian Government Department of Immigration and Border Protection, as well as other persons or organisations where necessary for these purposes, provided the disclosure is consistent with the *Privacy Act 1988* (and other relevant laws). Your personal information may also be disclosed to relevant employees within your organisation for the purpose of approving your licence, registration or accreditation and to maintain the currency of your personal information for the purpose of the licence, registration or accreditation. Your personal information will be used and stored in accordance with the Australian Privacy Principles.

By completing and submitting this form you consent to the collection, use and disclosure of all personal information, including sensitive information, in this form to and by the relevant authorities in the importing country.

The Department of Agriculture and Water Resources has not taken steps to ensure that the relevant authorities in the importing country do not breach the Australian Privacy Principles. This means that:

- relevant authorities in the importing country will not be accountable under the Privacy Act
- you will not be able to seek redress under the Privacy Act
- you may not be able to seek redress in the overseas jurisdiction.
