


Value of agricultural production and exports








Major Australian agricultural exports




Total factor productivity and farmer terms of trade 1977 to 2014


China population by income and urban share, 1950-2050


China food imports – 2009 and 2050


Value of agricultural exports, 2014




Agricultural productivity index comparison






