The suspect gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during post-mortem inspection and the carcass was retained in the chiller along with the corresponding hide. Heavy bruising was observed down the midline of the back and forequarters (photos 6,7 & 8). The neck was completely missing including vertebrae extending towards the shoulder (photos 10). The rod passes through a small hole in the hide at approximately the midline, only 1 small hole could be found (photo 11,12,13&14). A small piece of shrapnel was visible and is shown in photo15.

The suspect gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during post-mortem inspection. The carcass and corresponding hide were retained in the chiller. Heavy bruising was observed along the mid line of the back and extending over the right forequarter and side (photos 6,7 & 8). In the thoracic cavity, a hole is present with broken ribs 11 and 12 on the right side (photo 9). Closer inspection of the hide and underside of the neck revealed a very small hole in hide and soft tissue of carcass (photos 10,14&16). The neck is intact. A rod was passed through the holes in the hide (photos 11&15).
OPV summary: fascial and soft tissue hemorrhage present over most of the dorsal thorax and corresponding subcut hemorrhage inside the hide, hole 1 is located right distal/caudal thorax, it is relatively large with surrounding soft tissue and rib damage. Hole 2 is ventrally located between the neck and thorax, it is smaller and without surrounding tissue damage visible.

The suspect gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during the post mortem inspection. The carcass and its corresponding hide were retained in the chiller for further investigation. There is a large bruise on the back of the carcass at the mid-line extending toward the shoulders (Photo 6). Broken ribs 7, 8 and 9 and corresponding vertebra on the left side of the carcass (photos 10 & 11). The rod passes through the back of carcass as seen in photos. There is one small hole located on the hide and rod passes through (photos 12-15). No second hole was found. The neck is intact (photo 9). There is some grazing lower down on the left side of the thoracic cavity which is consistent with a knife performing bleeding task.

Many areas of the approved arrangement (AA) did not reflect the operations or were not sufficiently detailed to demonstrate that the Act, Rules and relevant Australian meat Standards would be met.

Evidence:

1. There were contradictions identified throughout the AA which resulted in these aspects not being able to be effectively audited. For example:
 - The dropped meat boning (sanitation activity)
 - Non-return valves (water activity)
 - The program used to control inventory (product supply chain integrity activity)
 - Carton meat inspection (good hygienic practice activity)
2. Programs omitted essential information to demonstrate that the requirements were complied with. For example:
 - Sanitation of common contact points prior to post-mortem (sanitation activity)
 - Segregation between areas used for human consumption and animal food (good hygienic practice activity)

Throughout the audit, the auditee showed difficulty in being able to find the requested information within the AA SOPs and records. This was made more challenging due to a lack of references within the documents and due to similar topics being covered with different information in various sections of the AA. The internal audit process was not prioritised due to resource shortages which may have contributed to the errors persisting within the AA.

Findings:

At the time of the audit, the carton meat assessment (CMA) procedure, used to verify hygienic processing of carcasses, did not demonstrate compliance with the Meat Hygiene Assessment – product monitoring (version 3).

Evidence:

1. At the time of the audit, there was evidence to support that the procedures and knowledge were not sufficient to ensure CMA was conducted in accordance with the guidelines (MHA 3 – export meat operational guideline 16.1)
 - The operator and QA described that 13.5kgs was the sample size. The boning procedure SOP (PRC-1-014) monitoring section described that 13.5kgs would be inspected which reflected the outdated MHA 2 requirements for product monitoring. The MHA 3 SOP (PRC-1-021 version 1) described that an entire carton was the sampling unit.
 - The operator did not thoroughly check the product, individual hairs were being missed. Once the auditor pointed out several individual hairs the operator began to check more thoroughly and was able to identify more individual hairs.
 - The operator explained that a scorable hair defect would be 11 hairs on one piece. The auditor explained it was a total for the entire carton and therefore thorough inspection was essential.
2. The documentation and records lacked essential information, to enable the QAM to demonstrate to the auditor, that CMA was conducted in accordance with the MHA 3 product monitoring guideline.
 - The individual product types which would be assessed were not listed/identified in a manner that enable the QAM and auditor to verify that the correct product types had been verified for the production shift.
 - The monitoring record showed that the same meat cut (e.g. silverside) was checked repetitively as a low risk product type. When compared to the production schedule, there was evidence that other product types such as manufacturing trimmings were being produced. The monitoring form did not indicate what the packaging method was for silverside and it was explained to the auditor that it could be an individually wrapped product. As per the MHA 3 guidelines, an individually wrapped boneless primal product type would not be subject to CMA
 - Further discussion with other senior staff indicated that 'silverside' was packed in various ways (different product types). One of these was bulk bagged product, it was unclear whether the product type was required to be subjected to CMA inspection.

The system to identify, record and correct structural deficiencies was not effective to ensure that the processing premises and equipment were maintained in a good state of repair.

Evidence:

The red room which was used as the secondary processing room was in a poor state of repair. Although, there was evidence of ongoing repair and painting it was not adequate to maintain the area in a good state of repair. There was flaking paint in areas of the wall, damaged flooring, and rust visible on overhead structures.

The procedures outlined in the structure and maintenance program (PRC-1-007 version 12) and the product contamination control program (PRC-1-008 version 8) were not effectively implemented.

The open maintenance requests (GMP-702) were reviewed and there were no requests relating to the deficiencies noted by the auditor demonstrating a lack of reporting and recording of issues.

There were several open and overdue maintenance requests for other issues around the establishment which had not been updated with progress reports or reasons for the delay.

Findings:

The corrective action to ensure wild game meat and meat products met importing country requirements was not effectively implemented

Evidence:

The corrective action described in the Sampling Procedure Program (PRC-1-016 version 18) was not followed for microbiological carton samples. The program described that upon receipt of a failed or marginal carton or carcase microbiological results that three additional cartons would be sampled and if the additional results were unacceptable that product would be downgraded to the domestic market. The establishment was EU listed with APC limits as per the Microbiological Manual for Sampling and Testing of Export Meat and Meat Products ('m' = marginal was >10 000 cfu/cm², 'M' = unacceptable >31 625 cfu/cm²).

1. Overall, the establishment did not follow the AA corrective action when marginal APC results were received. During May, June and July the below marginal carton results were received, the product was not subject to corrective action or department disposition prior to being released to export markets.

- 16/05 22 000 cfu/cm²,
- 20/05 21 000 cfu/cm²,
- 21/05 22 000 cfu/cm²,
- 23/05 20 000 cfu/cm²,
- 07/07 11 000 cfu/cm²,
- 09/07 11 000 cfu/cm², and,
- 29/07 30 000 cfu/cm².

2. The establishment reported that three additional samples were collected when failed carton TVC results were received. However, when the additional results were not acceptable, the establishment did not follow the approved arrangement to downgrade the product to domestic and did not defer the disposition to the department. During May, June and July there were 4 fails for which retests were conducted, in two instances the retest did not return acceptable results and the outcome recorded by the establishment was that product was released to the export market. There was not market restrictions recorded or described by the auditee.

- 30/05 first TVC result 340 000cfu/cm², one unacceptable retest result of 49 000 cfu/cm² followed by another round of retests.
- 24/06 first TVC result 310 000 cfu/cm², one marginal retest result of 31 000 cfu/cm².
