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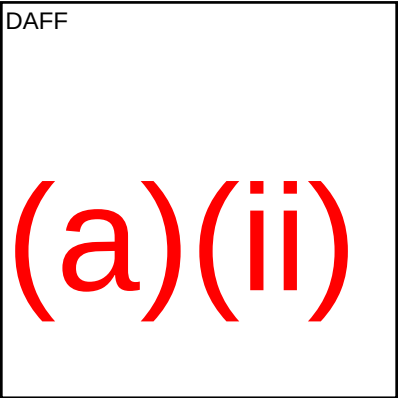

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Scott - will put together brief for DAFF then set up meeting

Considering how to use leg to deal with multi-strain vaccines - how to get around registering each strain as separate active - would be costly and time consuming

In process of looking at that - have found have an inability to do that for multistrain vaccines, but also shouldn't currently be doing it for current ag and vet products - each registered product should have a single registered formulation

11% of ag, 4% of vet estimated to register multiple formulations against single product

A lot inherited from states at formation of APVMA - so obviously was that intent at outset of NRS

No safety, env, trade concerns

e.g. supplier adds different coloured dyes to products - no bearing on chemical outcome but are diff formulations

Also - same active but at different rates/concentrations - same dose, though

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Have ~50 current applications to vary existing multiple formulations

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
