



Agriculture Stewardship Package

Carbon + Biodiversity Pilot Round 2

Australia's agriculture industry depends on a biodiverse and well-managed natural resource base.

The \$66.1 million Agricultural Stewardship Package aims to incentivise adoption of improved on-farm land management practices and develop a mechanism where farmers are rewarded for their efforts in delivering biodiversity and sustainability services that benefit their farms and the broader community.

The second round of the Carbon + Biodiversity Pilot will trial a market based mechanism to reward farmers for increasing biodiversity.

Farmers who undertake plantings for carbon can receive additional payments for maximising the biodiversity benefits from these plantings by:

- planting a mix of species
- managing and looking after vegetation.

Plantings can also benefit farmers by:

- providing shelter for animals
- protecting dams and waterways
- reducing erosion.

Payment for biodiversity and other environmental services including the sale of carbon credits can supplement traditional farm income.

Pilot regions

The Carbon + Biodiversity Pilot is seeking applications for projects to fund from 2021 to 2023.

The Pilot will run in 6 Natural Resource Management Regions to test the biodiversity protocols.

- Fitzroy Basin in Queensland.
- Riverina in New South Wales.

- Goulburn Broken in Victoria.
- Southern in Tasmania.
- Hills and Fleurieu in South Australia.
- South Coast in Western Australia.

Rewards for biodiversity outcomes

The pilot will trial a market based mechanism to reward biodiversity outcomes in combination with carbon planting projects under the Emissions Reduction Fund.

Participating farmers will:

- receive payments for increasing biodiversity
- establish new plantings in line with biodiversity protocol
- report biodiversity outcomes and allow monitoring and verification
- register the new plantings under the Emissions Reduction Fund and meet their requirements to receive carbon credits (Australian Carbon Credit Units)
- manage and maintain plantings for at least 25 years.
