# EU vendor declaration form version 0720

## Oestradiol treatment declaration



### The hormone Oestradiol 17 $\beta$ (or its ester-like derivatives) is banned for use in EU-eligible cattle

The European Union Vendor Declaration (EUVD) version 0720 now requires you to confirm whether your cattle have been treated with oestradiol treatments. A supplementary declaration form is also available for use with the old EUVD version 0413.

The amended EUVD version 0720 is available from Livestock Production Assurance (LPA) through normal ordering processes. The supplementary declaration is available at [agriculture.gov.au/eucas](http://agriculture.gov.au/eucas).

#### New EUVD form 0720

#### Supplementary EUVD form

FROM  
**1 NOV 2020**

Male EU-eligible cattle should be transferred on the EUVD version 0720 where possible.

Homebred female cattle that have not been treated with oestradiol should be transferred on the EUVD version 0720 where possible.

Alternatively, on the old EUVD version 0413 with a supplementary declaration.

FROM  
**1 MAR 2021**

To remain EU-eligible, all European Union Cattle Accreditation Scheme (EUCAS) cattle must be accompanied by the new EUVD version 0720. Alternatively, by the old EUVD version 0413 with a supplementary declaration.

FROM  
**1 JUL 2021**

All EUCAS cattle movements must be accompanied by EUVD version 0720.

## Oestradiol treated cattle

All EUCAS cattle that may have been treated with Oestradiol for breeding purposes must be identified as non-EU eligible.

These cattle:

- cannot be exported to the EU
- can remain on the EUCAS property
- can have EU-eligible offspring
- must be marked as EU N in the NLIS database.

## Meeting EU country requirements

Amending the EU vendor declaration is helping to ensure Australia maintains EU market access by meeting country requirements for our exported beef products.
