Leatherback Turtle

Scientific Name: Dermochelys coriacea



Distribution: QLD, NT, WA, NSW

EPBC Act Status: Vulnerable, Migratory and Marine

Length: Up to 1.6m

Colour: Adults have a blackish shell, with pale spots on the skin that turn pinkish when out of the water, as blood flows to the surface of the skin to cool the body.

Key Features:

The largest of all sea turtles. Five distinct longitudinal ridges and no large scales on shell.

Preferred Habitat:

Temperate waters, rarely close to shore, often migrates to breed in tropical areas.
