Has more black on the underside of the pectoral and anal fins than Glyphis sp. C.

Key Features: Small eyes, with short and broadly rounded snout, and erect, broadly triangular, serrated upper teeth.

Preferred Habitat: Riverine or low-salinity waters. There are no validated records from the sea yet, although the species almost certainly occurs there.

Scientific Name: Glyphis sp. C



Distribution: NT, WA

EPBC Act Status: Endangered Length: 2-3m

Colour: Greyish, no distinctive colour pattern.

Key Features: Small eyes, with short but slightly longer snout than *Glyphis sp. A.* Erect, broadly triangular,

serrated upper teeth.

Preferred Habitat: Riverine or marine waters. There are several records from the sea, and these are all larger specimens.
