KEEP KHAPRA BEETLE OUT OF AUSTRALIA!



Khapra beetle is not present in Australia. It is a highly invasive pest that poses a major threat to Australia's grains industry. It destroys grain quality making it unfit for consumption. An outbreak could cost \$15.5 billion over 20 years.

Do your part to help stop the spread of khapra beetle

The following plant products are not permitted into Australia when brought in for personal use via low value sea and air freight or as unaccompanied personal effects, as they could be carrying khapra beetle.
