OPV comments: The apparent trajectory is indicated by the direction of the steel (picture 08 and 09). There are corresponding entrance and exit wounds on the hide. (picture 05). The apparent trajectory is through the left caudal thorax, exiting right. There is corresponding damage to the thoracic vertebrae. (picture 8 and 9). There is no bruising to the neck (07). There are no indications of wound healing. There are no indications the wound is associated with pre harvesting activities.

The suspect gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during the post-mortem inspection and was retained in the chiller along with the corresponding hide for further investigation. The carcass has a small bruise on the back midline and a second small bruise on the left side of the ribcage (photos 6 & 7). Upon examining the thoracic cavity, two holes were observed. The vertebra in line with the 9th rib is broken, and the 6th rib on the left side of the carcass is also fractured (photos 11 & 12). Photos 8 & 12 show a rod passing through the two holes in the carcass, indicating the trajectory. The neck is intact (photo 10).

Photos of the hide (13 & 14) show the rod passing through both holes on the hide. The hole on the midline is smaller and has a dark burn mark around it, which is clearly visible in close-up photo 15. The second hole on the left side is slightly larger and is shown in close-up photo 16 with a blue contrast in the background.

The suspect gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during the post-mortem inspection and was retained in the chiller along with the corresponding hide for further investigation. Only one wound was found on the carcass. There was bruising on the right side of the carcass as shown in the photo 8. The ribs were broken between 8th and 9th ribs as shown in photo 11 in the thoracic cavity. Photos 9 & 12 show the rod passing through the hole in the carcass, indicating the trajectory. The neck is intact (photo 10). Photo of the hide (13 & 14) show the rod passing through the hole on the hide. The hole on the hide is small and burn mark around it. No shrapnel found in the carcass.

The suspect gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during the post-mortem inspection and was retained in the chiller along with the corresponding hide for further investigation. Two holes were found on midline of the carcass forequarter with heavy bruising, the rod through the holes. The holes appear to pass through the spine bones without extending into carcass. The broken ribs were observed between 7th and 9th ribs, as shown in photo 11 of the thoracic cavity. The neck remains intact (photo 10). Photos of the hide (12, 13 & 15) show the rod passing through the holes both fur side and upper side of the hide. The NPWS tag was found on the floor, torn off from the hide.

The suspect gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during Post Mortem inspection and was retained in the chiller with the corresponding hide for further investigation. Only one wound was located on the carcass, positioned on the midline between the shoulders. There is heavy bruising across the back and tops of the shoulders. A rod is passed through at this point to indicate a trajectory shown in photos 6-8. Upon examining the thoracic cavity, the vertebrae and 1st set of ribs are broken seen in photo 10. The neck is intact photo 9.

Photos 12 show the fur side of the hide with rod passing through the hole on the midline.

Photos 13 show the skin side with blue rectangle indicating position of hole.

Photo 14 shows a close up view, with blue contrast behind, the hole is small with a burn mark around.

The suspected gunshot wound was identified by the AAO during the post-mortem inspection and retained in the chiller with the corresponding hide. The carcass showed bruising on the left side (Photo 9) and the right forequarter (Photo 7). There were fractures in ribs 3 and 4, with the corresponding vertebrae also broken (Photo 12). A large piece of shrapnel was found just below the skin fascia on the right forequarter arm (Photos 7 & 8). The neck remained intact (Photo 10).

A rod was inserted through the left side of the carcass into the region of the right forequarter but could not pass through completely. The rod is visible in Photos 6, 9, and 12. The hide matches the hole on the left side, and the rod can be seen passing through this hole toward the right side, where bruising is visible on the skin at the point of the right shoulder.
