# Kangaroo gunshot wound incident report

## Section A: General information

Purpose of this form	For export registered kangaroo-processing establishment managers or on-plant veterinarians to report detection of kangaroo carcase gunshot wounds to state/territory authorities.
	Gunshot wound carcases are not eligible for human consumption or pet food production and must be condemned.
	You must:
	<ul> <li>use a separate form to report each gunshot wound incident</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>use one form to report more than one carcase shot by the same harvester and on the same date</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>keep a copy of each completed form on file.</li> </ul>
