Performance standards for plant export registered establishments

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Definitions

The following table defines the terms used in this document.

Term	Definition
Act	Export Control Act 2020.
Activity categories	Groupings of like checklist items by activity.
Checklist item	Requirements under each activity category that have been grouped by function and assigned a non-compliance rating/s.
Core registered establishment performance standards	Performance standards that apply across all plant export registered establishments regardless of whether the establishment holds any registered functions. These include record keeping, plans and specifications, hygiene, pest control and structural requirements.
GFSI	The Global Food Safety Initiative (GFSI) Scheme oversees global food safety. In Australia, the GFSI benchmarked fresh produce food safety schemes are GLOBALG.A.P., Freshcare, British Retail Consortium (BRC) and Safe Quality Food (SQF).

Purpose of this document

This document:

- outlines the core performance standards registered establishments must meet to gain and maintain registration for the preparation and inspection of prescribed goods for export
- sets the non-compliance ratings for those core performance standards
 Note: Where more than one non-compliance rating is provided, the auditor can choose the rating depending on the severity of the non-compliance.
- must be read in conjunction with the Guideline: <u>Management of plant export registered</u> <u>establishments</u> and Guideline: <u>Audit of plant export registered establishments</u>.

Note: For the performance standards related to additional functions such as treatments for horticulture products to protocol markets **go to** the <u>related materials</u> section.

Performance standards

Record keeping

The following table outlines the performance standards and non-compliance ratings for record keeping at plant export registered establishments.

Recognition of GFSI benchmarked food safety certification for specific elements of the audit, only applies to inspecting **fresh fruit** and **vegetables**, and only if indicated in the 'Performance standards' column.

Current food safety certification is defined as holding a current valid certificate that has not expired, and that has been issued by a third-party, JAS-ANZ accredited audit certification body including GLOBALG.A.P., Freshcare, BRC, or SQF.
