#### In a nut shell...

 Weed Spotters is a citizen science project focussed on the detection, identification and reporting of new incidents of state restricted and prohibited weeds early so that preventative measures can be taken.

 A joint project between the Department of Environment and Science (Queensland Herbarium) Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (Biosecurity Queensland) and local government, with funding support from the Land Protection Fund.




#### In a nut shell...


- Weed spotters are provided with training, monthly bulletins and a handbook to guide them in their weed spotting activities.
- Volunteer regional coordinators provide support to Weed Spotters and promote the program in their regions.
- Weed Spotters submit a specimen to the Queensland Herbarium or send in photos via email or the Weed Spotter App to notify sightings.
- Remind they are part of something bigger
