
## PLANT BIOSECURITY POLICY MEMORANDUM 2002/11

## GENERIC IMPORT RISK ANALYSIS – FRESH PINEAPPLE FRUIT

This Plant Biosecurity Policy Memorandum (PBPM) provides stakeholders with a copy of the draft generic Import Risk Analysis (IRA) paper on the importation of fresh pineapple fruit.
