ANIMAL BIOSECURITY POLICY MEMORANDUM 2003/23

NONHUMAN PRIMATES – AMENDMENTS TO INTERIM QUARANTINE CONDITIONS

This Animal Biosecurity Policy Memorandum (ABPM) provides stakeholders with amended interim quarantine conditions for the importation of nonhuman primates (Attachment A). The requirements have been finalised after considering stakeholder comments on the second draft circulated under ABPM 2003/13. Unless there is comment that warrants further change, these requirements will come into effect on 26 September 2003.

Attached to this ABPM are finalised amended interim quarantine conditions for the importation of nonhuman primates.

A draft set of conditions was one of a number of proposed amended quarantine requirements for the importation of a range of zoo animals circulated under ABPM 2002/50 of 4 December 2002. A number of stakeholders commented on these proposals. In light of those comments, another draft was circulated for stakeholder consideration and comment under ABPM 2003/13 of 29 April 2003.

A number of stakeholders commented on the April draft conditions. Biosecurity Australia has taken these comments into consideration in finalising the attached conditions. The final conditions differ from the draft circulated in April in the following:

- A single protocol replaces separate protocols for marmosets and tamarins, and other nonhuman primates.
- Pre-export testing for tuberculosis is required for all nonhuman primates and the testing requirement is more specific.
- Testing of macaques for herpes B virus and gibbons and great apes for hepatitis B virus is no longer mandatory.
- Individual identification using an ISO-compliant microchip is required.
- Treatment with broad-spectrum parasiticides is specified.
- Recommendations relating to testing (of gibbons and great apes) for hepatitis B, culture for enteric pathogens, additional testing and treatments for parasites, and precautionary occupational health and safety measures, are separated from the protocol proper and are provided as an addendum.

The interim requirements are only to apply until completion of the nonhuman primates Import Risk Analysis (IRA) currently being undertaken and the consequent adoption of a new policy. As part of the IRA, we circulated for comment a Technical Issues Paper (ABPM 2003/08 of 20 March 2003) that identified the main pest and diseases. Biosecurity Australia is considering stakeholder comments on the Technical Issues Paper as we develop the draft IRA report, the next consultation step. This report will be circulated for 60 days public comment.

Next Steps

Unless there is comment that warrants further change, these interim requirements will come into effect from 26 September 2003. Thank you to those stakeholders who contributed to the review of these conditions.
