PLANT BIOSECURITY POLICY MEMORANDUM 2003/21

REVIEW OF IMPORT CONDITIONS FOR CEREAL SEEDS FOR SOWING FROM NEW ZEALAND

This Plant Biosecurity Policy Memorandum (PBPM) advises stakeholders of the commencement of a review of the Australian import conditions for winter cereal seeds for sowing from New Zealand.

The purpose of this PBPM is to notify you that Biosecurity Australia is commencing a review of import and post-entry quarantine conditions for seeds of winter cereals (barley, oat, rye, triticale and wheat) for sowing from New Zealand.

Limited quantities of seeds of winter cereals have been imported into Australia for breeding purposes for many years. The seed imports are subject to quarantine conditions, including inspection, seed treatments and growth in post-entry quarantine facilities, in order to manage the risks of seed-borne pests and diseases of quarantine concern to Australia. The Australian Quarantine and Inspection Service (AQIS) has approved some private premises for open quarantine nurseries since 1988.

AQIS implemented revised conditions in 2001 for the importation of seeds of barley, oat, rye, triticale and wheat from New Zealand into open post-entry quarantine, after consultation and broad support from industry and State departments of agriculture. However, New Zealand has since made changes to its quarantine inspection procedures, seed certification scheme and Import Health Standards.

Biosecurity Australia will review the Australian import and post-entry quarantine conditions in collaboration with AQIS and Plant Health Australia. A review of the quarantine pest list and a joint audit of the New Zealand certified seed scheme is planned.
