

Attachment B: Fees and charges for livestock exports

Overview

The department has redesigned its cost recovery arrangements with new fees and levies coming into effect on 1 December 2015. This fact sheet has been developed to provide you with an overview of the key changes to charges relating to livestock exports. This document should be read in conjunction with the department's Charging Guidelines and the Live Animal Exports Cost Recovery Implementation Statement (CRIS).

Key changes

Export licence and approved arrangement levies

All livestock exporters must have a valid export licence. Livestock exporters will be charged an annual levy of \$25 000 for an export licence, unless they operate an approved arrangement in which case they will be charged either \$10 000 (arrangement for exportation by air) or \$20 000 (arrangement for exportation by sea or both air and sea).

Livestock exporters that meet the criteria as small and infrequent exporters will be able to apply for an annual exemption from an approved arrangement. The cost for an application is \$600. Those exporters that are granted an exemption from holding an approved arrangement will be required to pay an annual export licence levy of \$5 000.

Application charges

There is a \$600 levy that participants in the export process must pay when applying:

- for a livestock export licence
- for approval of an arrangement in relation to the export of livestock
- for an exemption to an approved arrangement
- for approval of an ESCAS
- for a veterinarian for accreditation
- to register premises to be used for holding and assembling live stock for export.

There is a \$300 levy that participants in the export process must pay when requesting a variation to:

- a livestock export licence
- an approved arrangement in relation to the export of livestock
- an ESCAS approval
- a veterinarian accreditation
- a registered premises to be used for holding and assembling live stock for export.

Livestock throughput levies

The throughput charges will be reduced, from \$6.47 and \$2.57 per head of exported cattle, buffalo and camelids to \$1.21 per head, irrespective of the export market. The throughput rate for exported sheep and goats will also reduce from \$0.37 and \$0.34 to \$0.31 per head irrespective of the export market.

Premises charges

Owners of establishments that are registered for the export of livestock by sea will be charged an annual levy of \$5 000. Premises that are approved for the export of other animals and reproductive material will continue to be charged a fee for service to assess that the premises meets importing country requirements.

Inspection and audit fees

All live animal and reproductive material exporters will be subject to standard inspection fees of \$54 per quarter hour and audit fees of \$43 per quarter hour as required.

Where there is a request for an additional inspection (inspections that are not mandatory for the department to undertake) to take place, a higher rate of \$71 per quarter hour will apply. In circumstances where there is a need for a specialist auditor (e.g. veterinarian) to undertake an audit, a higher rate of \$103 per quarter hour will apply.

Certificate charges

The department will charge for each health certificate and export permit issued. The cost per document for livestock exporters is \$60.

Where an exporter requests a replacement document for any reason (change in importing country requirements or changes to the consignment) a fee of \$500 per replacement document applies.

Overtime

Overtime changes have been standardised for activities undertaken outside of the department's standard span of hours, which are weekdays between 6:30am and 6:30pm. All activities undertaken outside of the department's standard span of hours will incur the relevant fee for service charge in addition to overtime charges (see Table 4).
