Q16 For the key possible ones - yes. For all - no. There will always be some unknowns. Any system introduced should attempt to prepare for the worst scenarios.

Q17 The rules sound equitable but have not seen them used in practice.

Q18 The difficulty here will be obtaining agreement on just who are the beneficiaries and to what degree they should contribute. The principle is simple the practice is fraught with grey areas.

Q19 If NEBRA is not consistent with other deeds there is a very real risk that vital time will be wasted at the start of an outbreak/incursion and that this could significantly reduce the outcome.
