Where NTMs are applied in the export of grapes to China



Vineyard

Grape vines are monitored for pests and diseases such as fruit fly, as per China's protocol.



Harvest

Biosecurity protocols require trained pickers, who keep boxes and grapes free of pests and contaminants. A first visual inspection is also conducted.




Packing and inspection

Grapes are handled with care and packed in a shed to ensure bunches remain free of pests and containments.



Treatment

Before or during export to China, grapes are treated by cold storage at a specific temperature and duration, as per China's biosecurity requirements.



Transport

Grapes are only transported in sealed refrigerated containers which are appropriately climate controlled to ensure that product treatment is effective. In line with China's requirements.



Inspection in China

Grapes are inspected on arrival in China to ensure there are no live pests. Testing for Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) may also occur.



Retailer

Some retailers have private standards that relate to the quality and bloom of grapes which are not government requirements.



Consumer

Delicious, healthy and sweet Australian grapes are available in China.
