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ANNUAL REPORT

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Introduction

Regional Forest Agreements (RFAs) are separate agreements between the Commonwealth Government and the State Governments of NSW, Victoria, Tasmania and Western Australia. Based on good science and extensive consultation, the Agreements set out broad strategies to achieve a balance between conservation and a sustainable and competitive forest industry. They are in place for 20 years. RFAs are subject to annual reporting during the first four years and thereafter five-yearly reviews, to report progress against milestones and recommend action where necessary.

In NSW there are three RFAs in place covering the North East, Eden and Southern regions. The Prime Minister, the Hon John Howard MP and the Premier of New South Wales, the Hon Bob Carr MP, signed the Agreement for the Eden region on 25 August 1999. An interim progress report was prepared in September 2001 covering the period 25 August 1999 to 30 April 2001.

In order to align the reporting timelines for RFA annual reports and NSW Forest Agreements, the State and Commonwealth Governments (the Parties) agreed to change the Eden RFA reporting date to a financial year basis. This report therefore covers the period 1 July 2000 to 30 June 2001. As a result, there is some overlap in reporting. Progress made during the period 30 April to 30 June 2001 is noted in this report.

To date, implementation of the Eden RFA has focused on preparatory tasks, with participating NSW agencies setting up processes and procedures for achieving the requirements set out in the Agreement, including the delivery of public reports. This has required a considerable amount of 'ground work' to establish the systems and processes for proper implementation. Consequently, progress towards some milestones has been slower than expected.

The Parties are continuing to work towards achieving a balance between a sustainable timber industry and the conservation of forested areas.

During the same period, the NSW Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) conducted three comprehensive audits on State forests assessing SFNSW's operational and planning requirements under the Environment Protection Licence. Results of these audits identified 34 breaches of the operational requirements of the Licence and warning letters were issued. Remedial work was also required for operational issues on non-compliance in 17 locations.
