Industry Advice Notice: 2014-03

Rock lobster fishery reopening – Maria Island biotoxin zone, Tasmania

Date of effect: 19/07/2014

The Department of Agriculture has been advised by the Department of Primary Industries, Parks, Water and the Environment (DPIPWE), Tasmania, that the Maria Island Biotoxin Zone was reopened to rock lobster fishing from 00:01 on Saturday, 19 July 2014.

Rock lobster from the Maria Island Biotoxin Zone, were tested and the results show PST levels are below the regulatory limit.

There are currently no rock lobster fishery closures due to biotoxins in Tasmania.
